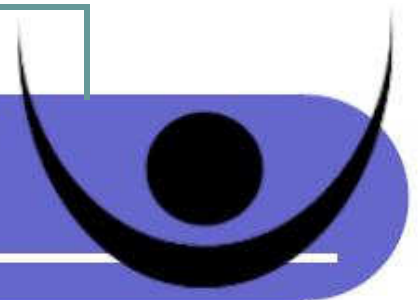

“Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.” Matthew 25:40

Last night I watched and listened as President Obama and Speaker of the House Boehner each made his case to the American people about the best way to seriously address the skyrocketing national debt while simultaneously raising the limit on the debt. One week before a deadline on any further borrowing arrives, the rancorous stalemate between Republicans and Democrats has many of us puzzled, embarrassed, frustrated, and wondering when the leaders of our nation will start acting like grownups.

It’s tempting to ignore the whole messy business (there IS a ball game on another channel) and assume they’ll eventually arrive at some kind of decent solution (something or someone’s gotta give)! It’s just as tempting for us Jesus followers to excuse ourselves from “dirty politics” by protesting it’s not our fight—that we’ve been gathered together to worship God, care for souls and invite people to faith, not bicker endlessly about budgets.

Recently a diverse group of more than 50 Christian leaders—evangelical, mainline Protestant, Roman Catholic, African-American and Latino—joined together to declare that the choices in the current budget debate DO concern God’s Church, because all people matter to God including the last and least:

“As Christians, we believe the moral measure of the debate is how the most poor and vulnerable people fare. We look at every budget proposal from the bottom up—how it treats those Jesus called ‘the least of these.’ They do not have powerful lobbies, but they have the most compelling claim on our consciences and common resources....”

These leaders have joined together to form a “Circle of Protection” around programs that assist the essential needs of hungry and poor people both here and abroad. Yes, it’s one more “special interest” among so many. But this is one that Jesus invites every follower to take up as his or her own as servants in our communities and as fellow citizens of a much blessed nation. JE

Exciting New Changes for Children's Christian Education!

Introducing a new day - **We will now be having "Sunday School" on Wednesday evenings as an alternative to the Sunday morning hour.** You can decide which day works best for your child(ren). Since this is the first year we are offering Wednesday night classes, we will be limiting the number the students enrolled. If your first choice is Wednesday nights, **please register early!** This change is being made to help reduce the sizes of classes on Sunday morning.

Our **model** is also changing! We will be using Augsburg Fortress's **SPARK - Activate Faith** materials again. However, we will use a rotation model rather than the classroom model. With the rotation model, students will work through one story for 3 weeks through various learning mediums: **Art, Bible Skills and Games, Cooking, Creative Drama, Music, Science, and Video!** The workshops will be very fun and the lessons are well planned. *Preschool students will **not** move to different rooms. The various learning experiences will come to them!*

With the rotation model we will not have "teachers" for the elementary classes. Rather, we will have **Shepherds** to take the students to the workshops each week. Also, we will have **Workshop Leaders** that will teach the same (or similar) lesson 3 weeks in a row.

We call on all parents and partners to help with Sunday school during the year. The lessons are based on a 3 week time frame. As you commit to helping with a lesson, you will serve for 3 weeks. You are welcome to sign up for as many 3 week sessions as you would like. We encourage you to share your talents often!

The Banquet has given more than 6,000 school supply packets to students this current school year. Ninety percent of those supplies are given to students right here in the Sioux Falls School District. The Banquet is the only agency that provides school supplies for students in need. Although their biggest push for supplies comes just before the start of the school year, The Banquet collects items for Project: S.O.S. year round.

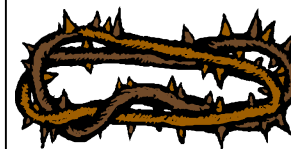
Word on Wednesdays

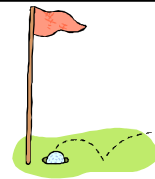
Garden Help Needed

Quilts For STAR Academy

STAR Academy stands for State Training and Rehabilitation Academy. Currently there are between 110 – 130 adjudicated youth receiving treatment and help with their chemical dependency, delinquency and /or mental health issues. One third of the residents are female, two thirds are male. Two girl's programs are located within Custer State Park, while three boys' programs are located south of Custer in the old state sanatorium. Both male and female youth receive quilts. Quilts are provided to two thirds of the youth at STAR Academy. The youth are able to keep their quilts after they have completed their programs, and take them with them when they leave.

SoJ will be sending 43 quilts next month. Each quilt is embroidered with a Bible verse. Thank you Lois Klein for making quilts and Sharon Starks for working with STAR Academy and helping distribute the quilts.

Growing in God's Word

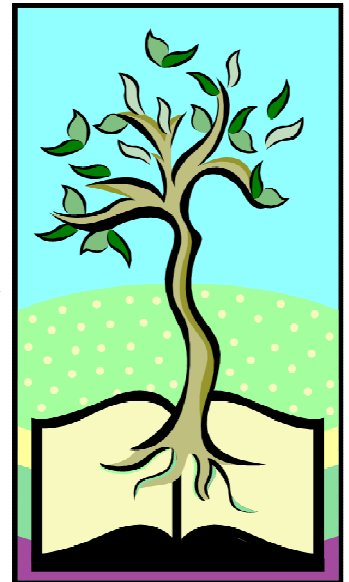

And suddenly, I was back in the United States of America.

It would be difficult indeed to encapsulate both all the emotions that accompany a transition home and the gratitude I feel towards those who sent me, and those who received me (going both ways, there and back) in a single newsletter entry. It was a life changing experience, an eye-opening experience, and, I truly believe, a God-led experience. And I thank you, Spirit of Joy, for your support in so many ways, of making the experience, the journey, possible.



And I hope to be able to tell you about it. I want you to know what it is you allowed me to feel and enjoy and learn. If you simply ask, “How was Mexico?”, I would rather tell you a story than give you a simple “Good.” I would tell you about the towns, the food, the shops, the noises and smells and sounds. I would tell you about the people – oh, do I have stories about the people! There are faces and their smiles I will never forget, voices and their laughs that I will forever remember dearly. As it is a second-hand experience, I know it will never be perfect. But you deserve to hear what I am able to tell.

I pray for open ears. Not that I don't think you will not listen! Rather, I have a couple of worries I must confess. First, I have heard powerful stories and learned a great deal about a number of very “heavy” and polemic topics (immigration, globalization, etc) that I feel compelled to share as much as – if not more so than – what I have to share about lighter aspects of life in Mexico. Second, this is Mexico we're talking about.

I have friends and fellow Young Adults in Global Mission who have been living in countries like Hungary, South Africa, and Uruguay – places about which people “back home” have very few preconceptions. I only hopped just south of the border, a locale that conjures up images of tacos and mariachi music. Allow me to help you to refine and/or replace what you thought you knew!

For both reasons, again, I hope to tell you about the people who defined my year in service. A national phenomenon or trans-national issue can be told in many different ways, but the interaction between one life and another is a more intimate and sacred thing. I've been told several times already “You must have been missing your family and friends terribly!” Well, this is true, but you have to remember there are connections now in Mexico that I am already missing now that I'm back! And I say with confidence that I believe this was the essence of my year abroad. Though I was there to teach English, and to be a servant to my neighbor, I know I received a great deal more than I had to offer.

Precisely because of this, the YAGM program emphasizes that our journeys do not end when we get on a plane in July. We have spent a year of our lives living – to the best of our abilities – as servants abroad. It is my prayer I may continue to do so now that I am back in my own culture, speaking my first language, and sharing my days with all of you.



Thank you, again, church, for your blessings, prayers, and support for me. May our entire community be blessed by what you have given me, what Mexico has given me, and what the Holy Spirit may yet lead us all to offer each other in warm fellowship with one another. ¡Dios los bendiga! Amen!
